# 2. GENERAL

The event will take place in the area called Capo S.Vito, a neighborhood on the coast of Taranto. The designated free beach is located on Viale del Tramonto near several commercial activities (Bars, Restaurants, B&Bs, camping).



### 3. HOW TO REACH TARANTO

#### **BY CAR**

#### From the North:

• A1 Milan - Bologna motorway then A14 Bologna-Taranto which ends in Massafra (last exit: Taranto Nord); to enter the city continue for about 20 km on state road no. 7 Appia, Massafra-Taranto. Alternatively take the SS106 dual carriageway dir (Palagiano) and then the SS106 dual carriageway towards Taranto

#### From the North and the West:

• A1 Milan - Bologna - Florence - Rome - Naples motorway, junction with the A30 Caserta - Salerno, at Nola junction with the A16 for Bari, at Canosa junction with the A14 Bologna-Taranto which ends in Massafra (last exit: Taranto Nord); to enter the city continue for about 20 km on state road no. 7 Appia, Massafra-Taranto.

Or via the Basentana state road until you cross the SS106 towards Taranto at Metaponto.

#### From the South:

- State road no. 106 Reggio Calabria-Taranto;
- A3 Reggio Calabria-Salerno motorway, exit at the 2nd exit for Sibari on state road no. 534 and continue towards Taranto on state road 106 Jonica.

#### **BY TRAIN**

The main railway lines that cross Taranto and the Province are the following:

- Line Roma Napoli Metaponto Taranto Brindisi
- Line Roma Caserta Bari Taranto
- Line Milano Bari Taranto Crotone -Villa San Giovanni

#### Ferrovie del Sud-Est

- Linea Taranto Bari-Martina Franca
- Linea Taranto Martina Franca Lecce

#### BY BUS

There are several bus companies to/from TARANTO (Marino, Itabus). The terminus can be at the Mercantile Station (via Napoli) near the FF.SS. Station or at the CIMINO Terminal on the EAST side of the city, depending on where you are coming from.

Once at the station or at the bus terminus, you can use many bus lines to reach the city center (Annex 3). The train station and the mercantile station are connected to San Vito with line no. 20.

The Cimino Terminal is a Park and Drive area, the bus terminus to reach the city center. Line 28C (not a direct route) connects it with the neighborhood of S. Vito.

#### **BY PLANE**

Taranto is connected to the airports of Bari (about 100 km) and Brindisi (about 70 km) where several airlines operate, including low-cost ones.

From Bari airport to reach Taranto (railway station) there are some shuttles (COTRAP Line) with fixed daily schedules (about 5 trips a day at a cost of about €10). From Brindisi Airport the same solutions but arriving at the Cimino Terminal.

Anyway the fastest and practical solution for the connection between the aforementioned airports and Taranto is car rental upon arrival.

### 4. WHERE TO STAY

Hotel and B&B booking sites can be of great help in choosing the accommodation that best suits your needs (distance, transportation, cost, etc.). However, in **Annex 2** there is a list of facilities that, in agreement with CONFCOMMERCIO TA and Lega Navale, will apply a 10% discount on the basic Booking rate for the "Trofeo Filippi" event in the period between 21 and 25 May 2025.

### 5. TRANSPORTATION

To reach the race field area, enter "Viale del Tramonto" in Google Maps.

The "Primo Mare" beach (coord. WGS 40°25'27"N 17°13'19"E) is the first on the avenue on the right, it will be indicated by signs.

If you do not have your own vehicle, the location where the race takes place can be reached by public transport. A brief summary with the link to the service is provided in **Annex 3.** 

### 6. PROGRAMMA

#### ACCREDITATION - ARRIVAL (PROVISIONAL)

On Friday 23 May, the reception will be activated at the beach (map will be available).

The reception staff will have the function of registering the athletes and their companions, any cars and vehicles, and will provide:

- Welcome kit (athlete only)
- Car Pass for parking in the dedicated areas (Annex 4)

#### TRAINING PROGRAM (PROVISIONAL)

In view of the competition, according to the availability of the Filippi Shipyard that allows the use of boats, the COL allows pre-race training sessions, reserved exclusively for athletes registered for the competition. Training will begin on Thursday, May 22nd starting at 11:00 and will end on Friday, May 23rd at 12:00.

The booking method will be published as soon as it is available.

## TOURIST INFORMATION TARANTO

Taranto, located in Puglia on the Ionian Sea, is one of the oldest cities in Italy. Founded by the Spartans in the 8th century BC, it became one of the most powerful colonies of Magna Graecia.

Capital of the province of the same name in Puglia. It is the second largest city in the region by population and the third largest city in southern peninsular Italy. Currently the population is about 200,000 inhabitants. It is located in the Ionian Sea on the Gulf of Taranto.

It is nicknamed the city of the two seas, for its peculiar position between the Mar Grande and Mar Piccolo. The city is physically divided into three parts: the historic center of Taranto, the old city, is located on an island, connected at one end by the stone bridge that leads to the industrial district and at the other end of the island by the swing bridge that leads to Borgo Umbertino.

In the harbor of the Mar Grande, near the Cheradi Islands, in front of the city, a historic population of dolphins and other cetaceans lives and thrives; in the Mar Piccolo, mussel farming has been practiced for centuries on a large scale, especially mussels, whose products are known worldwide for their uniqueness.

Founded by the Spartans in the 8th century BC with the name of Taras, thanks to its strategic position in the center of the gulf of the same name, the fertility of its territory and trade, the city became one of the most important poleis of Magna Graecia. It is in fact defined as the capital of Magna Graecia. It was the birthplace of the intellectuals Archita, Aristoxenus, Livius Andronicus, Leonidas and Heraclides of Taranto as well as athletes whose exploits became famous throughout the Greek world, such as Icco and the so-called Athlete of Taranto whose remains are kept in the MARTA museum of Magna Graecia, unique in the world in which priceless finds are kept.

After Roman domination, the city came under Byzantine, Norman and Aragonese control, until it became an important military and industrial center in modern Italy.



#### **MAIN ATTRACTION**

#### 1. Aragonese Castle

This imposing fortress, built in the 15th century by the Aragonese, is located close to the sea and can be visited with free guided tours offered by the Navy.

#### 2. Swing Bridge

It connects the old city with the new city and opens to allow the passage of ships. It is one of the symbols of Taranto.



#### 3. Historic Center (Old Town) and Cathedral of San Cataldo

The ancient village, with its picturesque alleys, is home to the Cathedral of San Cataldo, the oldest in Puglia, famous for its Byzantine crypt and Baroque Cappellone (big Chapel).



One of the most important archaeological museums in Italy and the world, with an extraordinary collection of gold and finds from Magna Graecia.

The islands of San Pietro and San Paolo, off the coast of Taranto, offer crystal clear sea and pristine beaches, ideal for an excursion.

#### 7. Jonian Dolphin Conservation

It is a scientific research association aimed at studying the cetaceans of the Gulf of Taranto in the Northern Ionian Sea. Deep connoisseurs of the marine environment in its most diverse aspects. The goal of protecting the cetaceans of the Gulf of Taranto can only be achieved by creating awareness in the population that cetaceans still exist in our sea.
